

To insure realism, passing cards for second string quarterbacks who threw less than 100 passes were adjusted according to their past records or reduced below the records achieved by their teams' first string quarterbacks. To further insure realism, certain substitute running backs' yards per carry average were reduced by their longest runs. We suggest that you throw few or no short or long passes to potential receivers who do not have any listing (completed pass caught) for that type of pass on their receiving cards. Also we suggest that the following players limit their participation to the number of games found below:

B. Hawkins — Philadelphia — 4 games
 G. Garrison — San Diego — 7 games
 O. Stowe — Dallas — 7 games
 J. Namath — N.Y. Jets — 6 games

For those who wish to apply the 1974 NFL rule changes to Strat-O-Matic Football, the following adjustments may be made: a 15 minute sudden death period may be played; reduce kickoff distances by 5 yards (a kickoff received on the 5 yard line would now be received on the 10 yard line); increase distance for attempted field goals by 10 yards (if a field goal is being attempted on the 25 yard line, refer to the specialist card for a 35 yard attempt); missed field goal attempts may be returned to the line of scrimmage or 20 yard line, whichever is further from the goal line; for punts out of bounds, subtract 10 yards off result found on specialist card.

Below are two listings indicating percentage of attempts a team rushed offensively (offensive rush percentage) and the percentage of attempts a team was rushed against defensively (defensive rush percentage).

SUGGESTED ADVANCED GAME RULE CHANGES
PASS-RUN CONTAINMENT — Designed to deter the offense from calling runs in third down passing situations. IT MAY BE USED IN THIRD OR FOURTH DOWN SITUATIONS ONLY IN WHICH 5 OR MORE YARDS ARE NEEDED FOR A FIRST DOWN. THE DEFENSE MUST CALL PASS AND PLAY A 4 MAN LINE. If the offense calls a run to an area in which the linebacker is playing his normal position (playing in flat pass or look-in zone areas) and the white dice roll is 1, 2, or 3, play is stopped a maximum of one yard short from first down. Of course, if the reading from the offensive running card results in more than one yard short from first down, accept this result instead.
 For example, with a 3rd and 8 situation, the runner's card yields a no gain result, accept this figure rather than crediting the runner with a 7 yard gain.
 However, if the linebacker involved has vacated his zone (stationed in a blitzing position or double teaming a receiver), no adjustment is made to yards gained on play. This rule only applies to results read off running cards and may not be used within a team's own 10 yard line. Results derived from defensive cards remain the same.

3 MAN LINE — may be used at any time and must be announced by defense before offense sets up a play. One defensive lineman (preferably a tackle) is replaced by a defensive back who is placed in short pass zone. If a run occurs and an offensive lineman or defensive lineman's rating is needed, disregard the rating and always accept the figure most beneficial to the offense. This rule applies to all runs directed at vacated and non-vacated defensive positions. When this defense is used, reduce the pass rush rating by one. However, a team's pass rush rating may not be reduced to less than one. Assuming a white die reading of 4, 5 or 6, with a run attempted at a vacated defense position, always refer to the column with minimum number of defenders. IN UTILIZING THIS DEFENSE, THE DEFENSIVE COACH MUST ALWAYS INDICATE AND SET UP HIS DEFENSE BEFORE THE OFFENSIVE COACH HAS SELECTED HIS PLAY, AUTOMATICALLY CALL A PASS DEFENSE AND MUST NOT MOVE UP ANY LINE BACKERS TO THE SCRIMMAGE LINE.
