★ 1930 BASEBALL SEASON ★

Incredible is perhaps the best word to describe the 1930 season. Would you believe that the Phillies finished in last place despite 8 players batting over .300 including Chuck Klein and Lefty O'Doul hitting .386 and .383 respectively. Why a last place finish for the Phillies? Perhaps a 6.71 team earned-run average proved their undoing. This was the year of the New York Mets. Paced by Tom Seaver's 25 wins, the Mets easily won the National League pennant. In the World Series, they upset the Orioles, winners of 109 games. Harmon Killebrew with 49 home runs led a group of seven major leaguers who hit 40 or more homers. Killebrew barely won the home run crown as Frank Howard and Reggie Jackson hit 48 and 47 respectively! Pete Rose hit .348 (his highest ever) to lead both leagues in hitting. The 1969 season was previously released by Strat-O-Matic in 1970 with only the basic game features. Strat-O-Matic is now releasing the 1969 season in a TWO-SIDED FORMAT — basic and advanced.
