1962 NEW YORK (N.L.) - With a record of 40-120, many consider this team the worst in baseball history. Finishing last in batting, pitching, and fielding, they trailed San Francisco (pennant winners) by 60 1/2 games. Richie Ashburn's .306 batting average topped the team and Frank Thomas led in homeruns with 34. The beleaguered pitching staff was led by Roger Craig (10-24, 4.51 ERA), Al Jackson (8-20, 4.40 ERA) and Jay Hook (8-19, 4.84 ERA). Losers of their first nine ballgames, they quickly dropped to last place, and were mathematically eliminated from the pennant race August 6th.

STRAT-O-MATIC RE-CREATED PAST SEASONS

If you are interested in baseball history, you will discover that our matchless baseball oldtimer seasons are a joy to play with and also very enlightening. Strat-O-Matic is extremely proud of the statistical preciseness and "nostalgic feel" ingrained in each of our oldtimer sets, particularly our last two oldtimer season efforts, the 1927 and 1959 seasons. Both seasons include the super advanced features. This outstanding effort by the Strat-O-Matic statistical staff provides you with ball park factors, pitcher's hold, individual wild pitches, balks and passed balls, batter's clutch hitting, supplementary stealing and of course all basic and advanced features for this glorious season.

Tremendous energy is exhausted in creating a Strat-O-Matic oldtimer season. Over 1500 man hours are necessary to create an oldtimer basic and advanced version of Strat-O-Matic Baseball and an additional 500 hours is necessary for a super advanced version. Why so many hours? Strat-O-Matic statisticians must go over each and every box score in order to extract all lefty-righty data and other information not contained in the official baseball records. In addition, all issues of The Sporting News are read for that specific year. In this way, we are also able to develop accurate player ratings. Are these "monster" exertions worthwhile for the baseball fan? We think so. If Strat-O-Matic did not construct this data, we would be forced to utilize the same statistical technique that our competitors use - contrived standardization of the necessary needed statistics. For example, all right handed hitters might be assigned statistics 30 points above their averages against lefty pitching and 15 points below their averages against righty pitching. Doubles, triples, homeruns and walks would also be standardized in the same manner. Irregularities would not exist. How good is this system? Totally unrealistic! In the baseball statistical world very few players conform totally to statistical standardization. Virtually every player's statistics would be partially or totally incorrectly represented.

How accurate are Strat-O-Matic lefty-righty statistics? We feel that they are very accurate for our purposes, although not as accurate as current lefty-righty breakdowns. The following comparison between 1962 major league club data and lefty-righty statistics developed by Strat-O-Matic illustrates the accuracy of Strat-O-Matic's statistical efforts. We were able to obtain major league lefty-righty information for certain teams from the 1962 season. It must be noted that the major league team statistics used for comparison purposes were not necessarily 100% correct as they also constructed their statistics by hand. Major league club lefty-righty homerun breakdowns for 46 players compared to Strat-O-Matic statistics found the following comparison: 34 players or 74% were in agreement, 10 players or almost 22% differed by one homerun and only 2 players differed by 2 homeruns. Thus 96% were exactly the same or differed by one homerun. We think that is pretty good. Concerning batting averages, a total of 74 players were compared for their batting averages hit off righty pitchers. 65 players or almost 88% differed by 10 points or less and only one player differed by more than 20 points. We think that also is pretty good.

Incidentally, during our extensive 1927 research efforts, Strat-O-Matic uncovered an original American League statistical source error. St. Louis Browns pitcher, Elam Vangilder was incorrectly credited with 100 more pitching at-bats. A Strat-O-Matic statistician contacted the Hall of Fame for verification of this error. The Hall of Fame acknowledged the original error and revised their files concerning Vangilder's pitching record for the 1927 season.

For the first time, Strat-O-Matic is reintroducing a previously released season that initially contained advanced game play. Each "revival" season will be updated to contain ratings and all statistical data necessary for SUPER ADVANCED play. Our first "revival" year is the 1978 season.

At Strat-O-Matic, we "burn the midnight oil" to give you the most realistic set of statistics and ratings for our oldtimer seasons. It may cost a few dollars more to purchase one of our prestigious oldtimer sets, but each season is a rare realistic "gem" unequaled in the baseball board game and computer game worlds.

1927 BASEBALL SEASON

Perhaps the most famous of all baseball seasons and the first Strat-O-Matic oldtimer season containing super advanced ratings and rules. New York, acknowledged by many as baseball's greatest team, dominated the American League, winning by a nineteen game margin. The National League race was a thriller with Pittsburgh nosing out St. Louis and New York. Only two games separated these three teams! However, Ruth's 60 homers and the tremendous power, pitching and defense of New York (AL) dominated this season. Many Hall of Famers dotted the rosters including Ty Cobb, Tris Speaker, George Sisler, Walter Johnson, Rogers Hornsby, Grover Cleveland Alexander, the Waner Brothers, Lefty Grove and of course, Ruth and Gehrig. Ten batters averaged over .350 and 7 pitchers won 20 or more games. The 1927 cards are two-sided and printed on perforated stock. The advanced side of each player card is printed in 3 colors and the basic side is printed in one color. **This set of cards is set up for basic, advanced and SUPER ADVANCED PLAY.** All 16 teams (385 players or 20 regular players plus 4 additional players per team) with all game parts may be purchased for \$32.00. 1930 BASEBALL SEASON

Incredible is perhaps the best word to describe the 1930 season.
